Applying the Lesson

Forgiveness: When Joseph's brothers hurt him, he forgave them. Forgiveness means letting go of anger and choosing kindness instead. Even when things are tough, forgiving others can bring healing and peace.

Trusting God: Joseph faced many challenges, but he never lost hope. He trusted that God had a plan, even in hard times. We can learn from Joseph to trust God, even when things seem difficult.

ITEMS NEEDED: A box of 64

crayons

INSTRUCTIONS: Choose one player for this game. Spread the 64 crayons from the box on a table. The player will have 60 seconds to try and put all the crayons back inside and close the box. If they can complete the task before time runs out, they win a prize.

VARIATION: Make this a race between two players to see who can refill a box of 24 to 64 crayons the fastest.

WHAT'S THE POINT? God can make something good out of our mistakes or the mistakes of others that hurt us, just as he did for Joseph.

DRIVE IT HOME:

The Bible tells us that God is faithful to forgive us when we confess our mistakes. God sent Jesus to die for our sins, and when we admit we are sinners and ask for forgiveness, God wipes our slate clean. That doesn't mean we won't have consequences for our mistakes, but He will forgive us.

God also works out everything for our good. Just as He did with Joseph. When others hurt us like Joseph's brothers, or when we make mistakes, God can still help us grow, teach us, and prepare us for new challenges down the road.

If we want God to work things out for the good, we need to first confess our sins. We need to tell God we are sorry, and we need to tell anyone we have wronged we are sorry as well. Once we've admitted our mistake, we need to also forgive ourselves.

We need to remember that none of us are perfect. When we ask forgiveness and forgive ourselves, it is then that God can work things out. Like an artist who had made a big mistake on a masterwork painting, God can show us the brushstrokes to make something beautiful out of our errors. God will use our mistakes to grow our faith and to show others He is faithful to forgive.
